Immunization Requirements for High School Students

According to Washington State Immunization Law (RWC 28A210.120), an inadequately immunized child (unless properly exempted) <u>cannot</u> be allowed to attend school. Students need to have the following immunizations in order to attend school for the 2014-2015 school year:

DTaP/DT/Td/Tdap	3 doses	with last on or after 4th birthday
Polio:	4 doses 3 doses	if last before the 4 th birthday with last on or after the 4 th birthday
Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR):	2 doses	dose #1 on or after first birthday dose #2 given at least 28 days later
Hepatitis B:	3 doses	dose #2 given 28 days after dose #1, dose #3 given at or after 6 months old, and 2-6 months after dose #2
Varicella:	2 doses **	dose #2 given 28 days after dose #1, or show proof of immunity by blood test, or get healthcare provider verification of disease, or get healthcare provider Certificate of Exemption

**This is a new requirement for all 9-12th graders starting the 2016-17 school year

The exact day, month and year must be recorded for all immunizations.

NO Shots = NO School

Locations to obtain immunizations

- 1. Private health care provider or clinic of your choice
- 2. Free Clinic of Southwest Washington for students 18 years old and younger who have no medical coupons or insurance.

You MUST bring immunization records.

Please bring a note or stamped immunization card to the school office, from the clinic or doctor, indicating the date and vaccination received.
