

Immunization Requirements for High School Students

According to Washington State Immunization Law (RWC 28A210.120), an inadequately immunized child (unless properly exempted) cannot be allowed to attend school. Students need to have the following immunizations in order to attend school for the 2014-2015 school year:

DTaP/DT/Td/Tdap	<u>3 doses</u>	with last on or after 4 th birthday
Polio:	<u>4 doses</u>	if last before the 4 th birthday
	<u>3 doses</u>	with last on or after the 4 th birthday
Measles, Mumps & Rubella (MMR):	<u>2 doses</u>	dose #1 on or after first birthday
		dose #2 given at least 28 days later
Hepatitis B:	<u>3 doses</u>	dose #2 given 28 days after dose #1, dose #3 given at or after 6 months old, and 2-6 months after dose #2
Varicella:	<u>2 doses</u> **	dose #2 given 28 days after dose #1, or show proof of immunity by blood test, or get healthcare provider verification of disease, or get healthcare provider Certificate of Exemption

****This is a new requirement for all 9-12th graders starting the 2016-17 school year**

The exact day, month and year must be recorded for all immunizations.

NO Shots = NO School

Locations to obtain immunizations

1. Private health care provider or clinic of your choice
2. Free Clinic of Southwest Washington - for students 18 years old and younger who have no medical coupons or insurance.

Immunizations are given the first and third Wednesday of each month. Sign in at 5:00 pm. There is no charge for vaccines.

You MUST bring immunization records.

Please bring a note or stamped immunization card to the school office, from the clinic or doctor, indicating the date and vaccination received.
