What Parents Need to Know about Head Lice

Outbreaks of head lice are common in the United States among children between the ages of 3–12 years old. While outbreaks can be disturbing, lice are not a health hazard and are not responsible for the spread of any disease. Historically students have missed many, many hours, even days, of school while attempting to eradicate head lice and nits (eggs). Current recommendations are that no healthy child should be allowed to miss school because of nits/eggs.
